

Strategic Plan 2016-2018

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Introduction

On behalf of the Westmoreland County Federated Library System (WCFLS), otherwise known publicly as the Westmoreland Library Network, or WLN™, and its 24 Members, this 2016-18 Strategic Plan states a shared understanding of agreed-upon goals and priorities for the next three years. It is also meant to convey that understanding to associates and collaborators. Examples of associates and collaborators, who are in some cases funders, include: (1) the two major funders, the Office of Commonwealth Libraries in the PA Department of Education, and the Westmoreland County Board of Commissioners; (2) the National Science Foundation and various charitable foundations in Western PA; (3) program collaborators, such as the Westmoreland Symphony Orchestra (WSO), the Pittsburgh Ballet Theater (PBT), the AIU3 Math & Science Collaborative (MSC), the Westmoreland Intermediate Unit (WIU), the seventeen School Districts in Westmoreland County, and various universities and colleges.

All the above-named associates and collaborators are represented in the Plan's goals for growth, which are:

- Experiment with ways to engage with library patrons, especially with the use of technology.
- Develop and grow partnerships with community organizations to further the interests of our libraries and communities.
- Enhance programming opportunities for our libraries.
- Provide opportunities to raise the professional knowledge level of our library employees and volunteers, to enable them to meet the constantly evolving demands of libraries.
- Bring all our libraries up to an enhanced technology level, structure, and uniformity so they
 can better meet evolving technology challenges, and in such a way that the WLN
 headquarters can better support and maintain their technological needs. Much of this will
 be accomplished by E-rate.
- Explore ways of empowering and involving Member library employees and volunteers in the future direction of the WLN, such as through the Committee structure and internal staff website powered by SharePoint.
- Explore ways to be more efficient and cost effective.

Executive Summary

The 2016-18 Strategic Plan Committee reviewed two prior WLN Plans, for the 2005-09 and 2013-15 periods, and the current Plan of the Carnegie Library of Pittsburgh for the period 2013-17. The 2016-18 Committee elected to follow the format of the 2013-15 Plan. The process was enhanced by 124 interviews of key individuals, primarily in Westmoreland County, but also including interviewees from Allegheny, Cambria, and Berks Counties. Interviewees included major decision makers, some elected officials, as well as WLN and Member personnel, major library donors, and Head Start teachers. The interviews were done under an NSF I-CORP L grant (https://www.asee.org/i-corps-l/about) to the AIU3 MSC, as part of its broader STEM collaboration with the WLN during 2015. The collaboration has been in effect since 2014 (http://seceij.net/seceij/winter15/ccss ngss pilot.html). Key conclusions include that libraries can become even more effective by working: (1) more closely with formal educators and (2) within the broader, regional economic environment (which values STEM workforce development).

The 2016-18 Strategic Plan is also informed by the Pew Research Center 2016 report *Libraries and Learning* (http://www.pewinternet.org/2016/04/07/libraries-and-learning/). Pew highlights that 76% of survey responders say that "libraries serve the learning and educational needs of their communities" very well or pretty well. At the same time, Pew reports that users are often unfamiliar with specific learning-related programs, as well as recently available materials, such as e-books. Nevertheless, the latter's growing use may be helping to drive downward the use of physical library facilities, a continuing pattern that is also shown in the Pew report.

In the 2013-15 Plan period, the WLN, with its various special programs in the Arts and STEM, sought to build new collaborations for the benefit of its patrons and will continue to do so in the 2016-18 Plan. At the same time, it intended to build a more sustained source of financial support; this has not been realized yet. In fact, since 2004, the State subsidy, by far our main source of funding, has declined 33 percent in unadjusted dollars. Nevertheless, recognizing that we have only just started with this collaborative vision, the 2016-18 Strategic Plan reflects an even deeper commitment to it.

The Plan also reflects a continuing attention to economies of centralized services for Members, and targets shared programs and services as the way to a successful future for the Members and their patrons. Cost-containment, while not always high profile, is essential for providing visionary programs.

Mission Statement

The Westmoreland County Federated Library System (WCFLS), an alliance of public libraries in Westmoreland County, is dedicated to achieving excellence in providing library and information services for all County residents through the coordination of resources and services, the sharing of information expertise, and the promotion of library staff development for the mutual benefit of all member libraries.

History

In 1993, the WCFLS of 24 public libraries was formed to take advantage of an opportunity for increased funding from both Westmoreland County government and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. As a further result, resources began to be shared more readily, Library Directors and their Board Trustees became involved in decision-making for the WCFLS, and the quality of library service in Westmoreland County rose dramatically.

The WCFLS and its Members started to envision a new future for library service throughout the County. In January 2005, the WCFLS embarked upon the Westmoreland Information Network (WIN™) project. The goal of this project was to unite the libraries in a shared catalog with one integrated library system (ILS). The WIN Committee was formed to seek funding for the project and to select an ILS vendor.

Through hard work and diligence by the WIN Committee and WCFLS Board Directors, the WIN project was funded by a generous lead grant from the R.K. Mellon Foundation and a Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA) grant from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. The Westmoreland County Commissioners also provided an annual funding increase for ongoing technical support for the ILS. Polaris Library Systems was chosen as the ILS vendor.

On December 18, 2007, the vision of the WIN project became a reality. Twenty Westmoreland County libraries merged into a unified catalog on the Polaris ILS. Now patrons had access to over 765,000 items belonging to the WIN libraries. They were able to go to any of the libraries to borrow and return items. They were able to place holds 24/7 and have their materials delivered to the library of choice, and they were able to access their patron accounts on-line. These services were immediately embraced by the residents of Westmoreland County. By December 2011, the WIN vision was fully realized when public library participation in WIN reached 100%. Early in this transition, the trademarked public name Westmoreland Library Network (WLN) was adopted.

In January 2011, the WCFLS/WLN started down a path of significant administrative changes. The Office of Commonwealth Libraries had made the determination to merge the WLN with the then Westmoreland/Fayette Counties District Center. At that point, the WLN assumed responsibility for the Westmoreland portion, and the Washington County District Center assumed responsibility for the Fayette portion. The WLN established a new headquarters at its present GreenForge site. The transition was challenging; however, it quickly became clear that Westmoreland County libraries were benefiting from the now unified and streamlined services and from centralization at GreenForge.

In the past few years, the Polaris ILS has been significantly upgraded periodically, keeping abreast of much enhanced services and efficiencies, and the HUB has been relocated from its previous home at Adams Memorial Library to its present secure site at GreenForge. All of these things collectively have brought a sea change to Westmoreland County, including access to the over 900,000-item catalog via mobile devices of various kinds. This is the progressive path that we have travelled, and we intend to make our future "history" even more progressive by what we have put into the 2016-18 Strategic Plan.

Objective Two: Promote the Arts through special programming in partnership with Seton Hill, the Westmoreland Symphony Orchestra, the Pittsburgh Ballet Theatre; build new partnerships with arts organizations.

Objective Three: Participate in workforce development in partnership with the WIU, Westmoreland Development Council, Economic Growth Connection, and Westmoreland County Community College.

Goal Five: Promote Member service excellence by raising the professional knowledge of Member library employees, volunteers, and board members to meet the constantly evolving demands of libraries.

Objective One: WLN will offer and promote consistent and regularly scheduled staff training, including process sessions related to Polaris, cataloging, and other topics.

Objective Two: WLN staff will encourage participation in meetings, webinars, and conferences to increase the knowledge of emerging library trends and technologies so Member libraries can better serve patrons and meet or exceed Continuing Education Requirements.

Objective Three: WLN staff will offer training directed to higher levels of library services and marketing, such as desktop publishing, crowdfunding, social media, trustee training, using creative technology in libraries, and coding
